The latest edition of the Learning and Development Programme lists a number of events up to the end of 2023. We continue to use resources and expertise from around the diocese as well as external speakers for which we are grateful. Most sessions are in person at Flourish House, although we have included zoom sessions as well as events different locations. I am extremely grateful to a wonderful administration team who ensure that the arrangements for these events are carried out efficiently and accurately. However, to assist with planning, please consider booking on to events as soon as possible. We totally understand that the demands of ministry often mean arrangements change but do let us know if you can no longer attend an event, to allow the space to be released for someone else. From January 2024 you will have an opportunity to join a learning community to address the challenge of oversight ministry. This builds on the experience of days run this past year. For further information see the article inside the back cover. In January we are also launching the Lay Ministry Pathway with a revised set of resources. This will offer a greater degree of flexibility as candidates explore Lay Ministry. Pilot studies have been conducted over the past six months and we are grateful for those who have participated. The initial focus will be on Lay Pastoral Assistants and Lay Worship Assistants, Resources will offer foundation course materials and equipping in the core skills for the particular ministry as well as an opportunity to build on those core skills and to go deeper.

In addition, please see the pages that signpost to other resources including the College of Preachers and a link to Sarum College. You will also see guidance on how to find a Spiritual Director and to join a Reflective Practice Group.

The speakers will address various personal financial planning issues including the importance of planning ahead, saving and investing tips, buying property via a mortgage, what to expect from the clergy pension and church support for retirement housing (where required) and questions that in their experience face most clergy during their ministry and will encourage you to think about your financial futures and the importance of planning ahead.

The Leadership pathway is required training for all Clergy, Readers and many Lay Leaders. This pathway consists of Basic Awareness, Foundation and Leadership Training. These should be completed in order and refreshed every 3 years to ensure you are up to date with any changes in policy and procedures.

Oversight ministry - a learning community

What does it mean to have a ministry that carries oversight responsibility? How can that oversight role be a life-giving part of our ministry? This is familiar territory for bishops, from whom we receive the "cure of souls" and share in "episcope", an oversight ministry which is defined as a "focus for unity".

Leadership is never a "one size fits all" but as many church leaders are taking on further responsibility and are being increasingly called to release the gifts and to support the ministry of others, there are themes and approaches that it is valuable to explore together: such as working in teams, delegating leadership, working with and managing difference, and creating enabling structures.

From early 2024 we intend to create our first "Learning Community" of Oversight Ministers: between 8-12 participants who will commit to

meeting for six sessions over an eight to ten month period. Participants will receive input and be directed to a variety of resources both from within the diocese and wider afield. They will be expected share their own experience in a similar style to "Reflective Practice Groups" in order to learn from and support each other. Equipping for Ministry: Lay Ministry Pathway January 2024

Across the diocese, many people exercise ministry in churches and communities in a variety of ways, formal and informal.

Recognised ministries, such as Lay Worship Assistants or Lay Pastoral Assistants are commended by our Bishops and commissioned locally. Up to now we have used a single track pathway to these ministries, with local discernment and courses ensuring that people are well matched and equipped for ministry. Such a robust system ensures, as far as we are able, that those who exercise ministry are safe and accountable.

In a further development we are launching a flexible approach to discerning and equipping which will

- allow previous and relevant experience to be taken into account
- enable greater flexibility and increased support for delivering courses.
