Welcome to the latest edition of the Equipping for Ministry programme

To assist with planning, please consider booking on to events as soon as possible. We totally understand that the demands of ministry often mean arrangements change, but do let us know if you can no longer attend an event, to allow the space to be released for someone else.

The diocesan vision shows we are committed to sharing in ministry and to value, cherish and develop our gifts. Over the past year we have been developing the Lay Ministry Pathway with a revised set of resources. The pathway offers greater flexibility for participants exploring lay ministry, ensuring existing gifts are valued. We offer two separate occasions for church leaders to explore how the Pathway could be used and guidance in the effective facilitation of courses - on Thursday 1 May in person at Flourish House, and two other occasions on zoom later that month. Later in the year there will be an opportunity to reflect further on how we nurture and develop others in ministry under the heading 'Exploring the meaning and practice of Oversight Ministry', drawing on experiences particularly from Sheffield and Truro Dioceses.

As ministers, we face different challenges and have to learn to adapt and change constantly. This autumn we shall be relaunching and developing further, the idea of Reflective Practice and Communities of Practice. Groups such as these offer spaces in which to share ideas and chew over issues facing us. No one person has all the answers, but collectively we may make a difference. Church money matters - inspiring a generous church

Wednesday 26 February 10am - 4pm Flourish House

Please note, this is a training day for licensed clergy only. To find out about sessions for other church members sign up to the Money Matters newsletter.

The event, which will open with worship and a welcome from Bishop Michael, will provide space to reflect on the fundraising challenges within our churches and, drawing upon experience from across Bath and Wells, explore together some of the ways in which their future sustainability can be secured.

Throughout the day, the Giving and Funding team will share practical tools and resources designed to help parishes encourage generous giving from congregations and the wider community, as well as understand more fully what the role of the clergy is, and importantly, is not.

As we seek to value and cherish the gifts we have already received, as individuals and as churches, we will explore how these may be used to foster a more generous giving culture, that changes the narrative from 'passing around the begging bowl' to engaging in and enabling God's mission.

Jenny Hollingsworth, our Diocesan Secretary, who will join us as we seek to co-design with parishes a Budget Consultation exercise that will take place later this year.

Exploring the meaning and practice of oversight ministry

Thursday 25 September 10am - 4pm Flourish House

The term 'oversight ministry' does not sit comfortably with all people. Even the word 'oversight' may conjure up ideas of being 'overlooked' which couldn't be further than the intended meaning. This day helps us to reflect on what it is to release gifts in others. It will focus on what it is to enable and nurture others in their discipleship and ministry. It will help us to grapple with the uncertainty about letting go and stepping aside as others step into ministry without losing our own identity. We shall consider the precious commodity of time and how we may chose to invest this precious gift in others and ourselves in support of ministry in our churches and wider communities. We will explore the effectiveness of an oversight minister as one who continues to journey alongside those exercising ministry, reflecting with them, encouraging new ideas and being there if it doesn't work out well. We shall also consider how we might manage the expectations of others in the church and wider community to embrace the ministry of all. 

Safeguarding training

The Leadership pathway is required training for all Clergy, Readers and many Lay Leaders. This pathway consists of Basic Awareness, Foundation and Leadership Training. These should be completed in order and refreshed every 3 years to ensure you are up to date with any changes in policy and procedures. Basic Awareness and Foundation training can be accessed via the Church of England's <u>Safeguarding Portal</u>.

Leadership training can now be booked online via Eventbrite – this site allows you to manage your own booking. Pre and post-course work will be emailed to you as well as the adjoining workbook.
