Act of Contrition

We pray for all those who grieve the loss of loved ones, for those who have lost parents, partners, children, and friends. We pray for those who continue to be held hostage in Gaza and for all who lost lives or were injured in the attacks of 7th October.

We pray for those in positions of authority and influence with the power to stop the violence.

We pray for an end to war in Gaza and the West Bank and hope for true and lasting peace.
