Purpose

Grants for Church of England serving clergy (holding the Bishop's licence), or their family members who live with them, who are in need. Retired clergy and grants towards educational expenses are not eligible.

Eligibility and How to Apply

Contact the secretary above, by post or email. Individuals must apply directly but their form must also be signed by their Diocesan Bishop, by post or email.

Forms are sent to each Diocese in January. Trustees prefer to deal with all applications in May although exceptional emergencies may be considered at other times.

Eligibility and How to Apply

School fees and the educational needs of any children of clergy in the Diocese of Bath & Wells who are at school or in higher education.

Applications are considered by the Trustees twice a year, with those received by **31 January** being considered in February and those received by **30 June** being considered in July. Applications will typically relate to assistance with educational needs such as the purchase of items such as uniforms, books and IT equipment or to help with the cost of travel or extra-curricular activities.

Grants awarded will reflect the merits of individual applications as well as the number and quality of other applications received by the same deadline. Applicants are asked to note that the award of a grant does not guarantee that a similar award will be made in subsequent years. No single grant will exceed the sum of £1,000.
