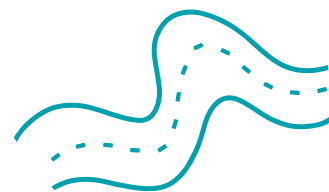

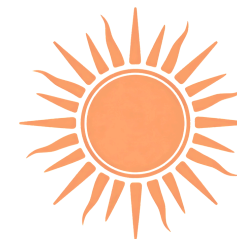

Lord's Prayer – compare

We first see the prayer that Jesus taught us in the Bible in Matthew 6: 9-13 where Jesus was teaching his disciples how to pray.

This, then, is how you should pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.

Christians use two versions of the Lord's Prayer today, the traditional version and the contemporary version. In 1662, the traditional version was introduced in the Book of Common Prayer. Then in the 1970s a contemporary version of the Lord's Prayer was introduced. The structure of both versions is the same. However, the contemporary version introduced new language.

In this pack there are three different versions of the Lord's Prayer on visual slides.

- The traditional version
- The contemporary version
- A modern interpretation

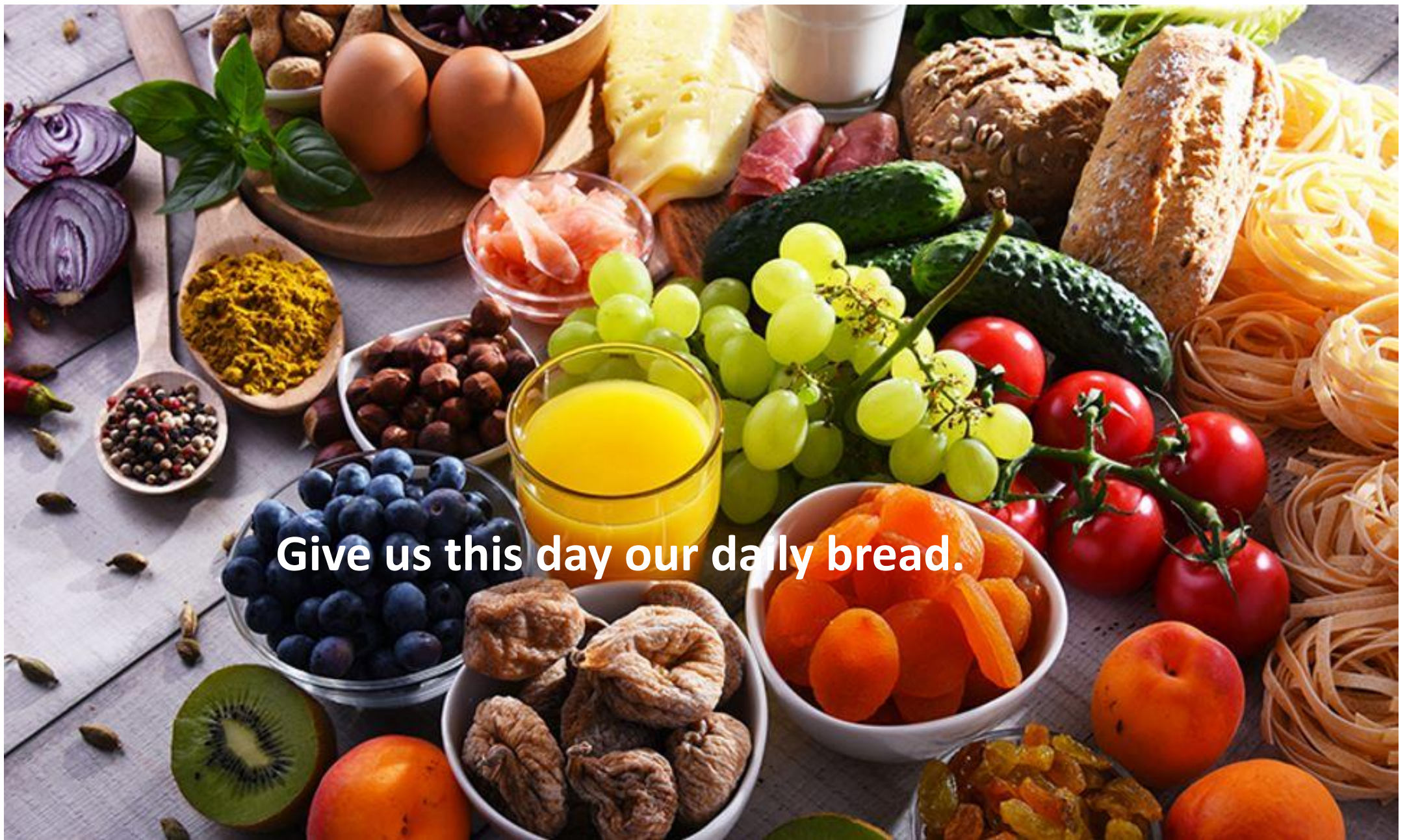
The idea of this prayer activity is to spread the three different versions of the Lord's Prayer out before you. This can be done individually or in a group. As you reflect on the different versions, think about which version you like or which version you best relate to. If you are doing this in a group, you can discuss why.


There is not a right or wrong answer, you can choose one version or mix and match. You can even write your own version. The idea behind this activity is to explore how you can better engage with and relate to the prayer that Jesus taught us.

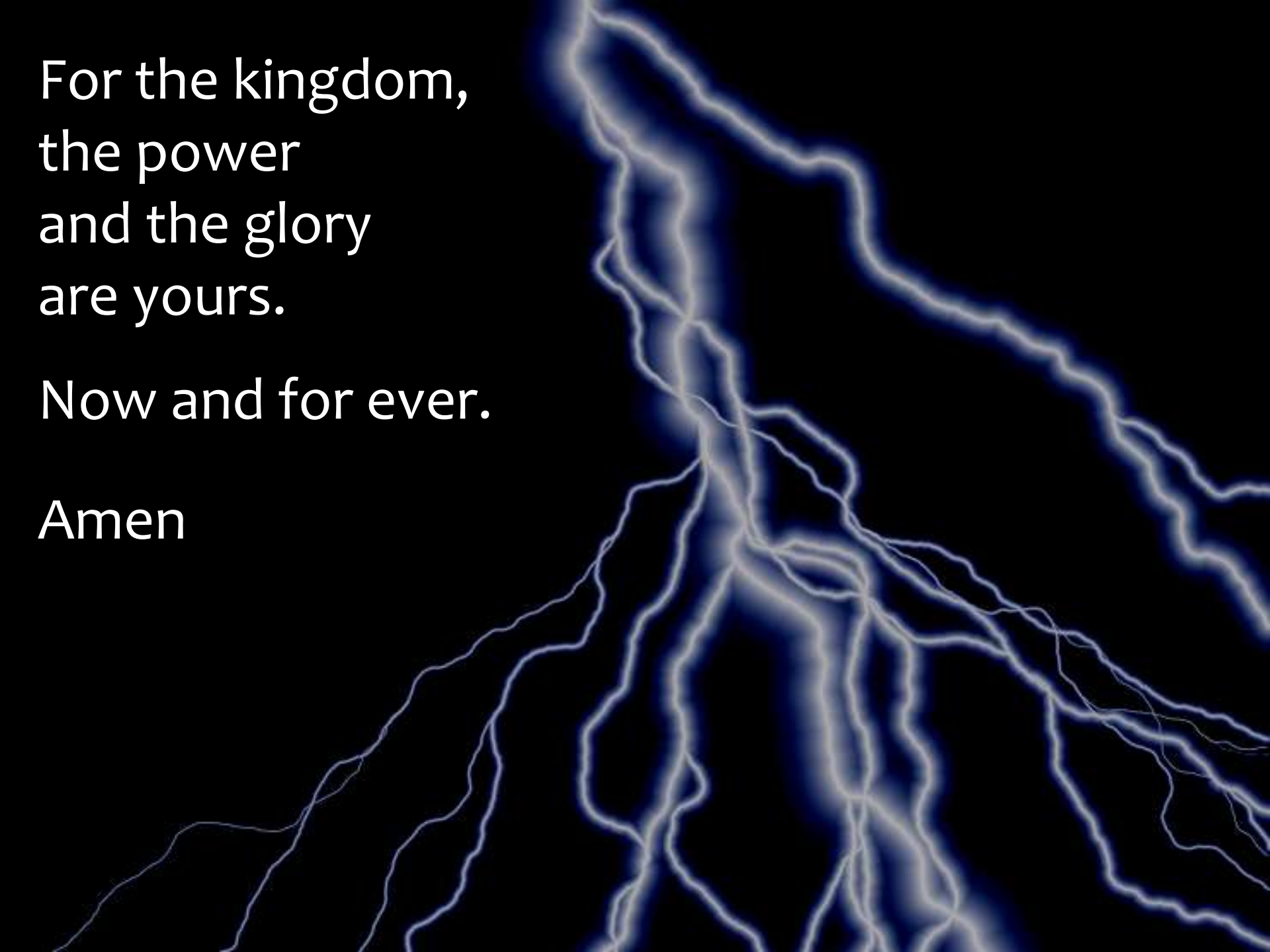



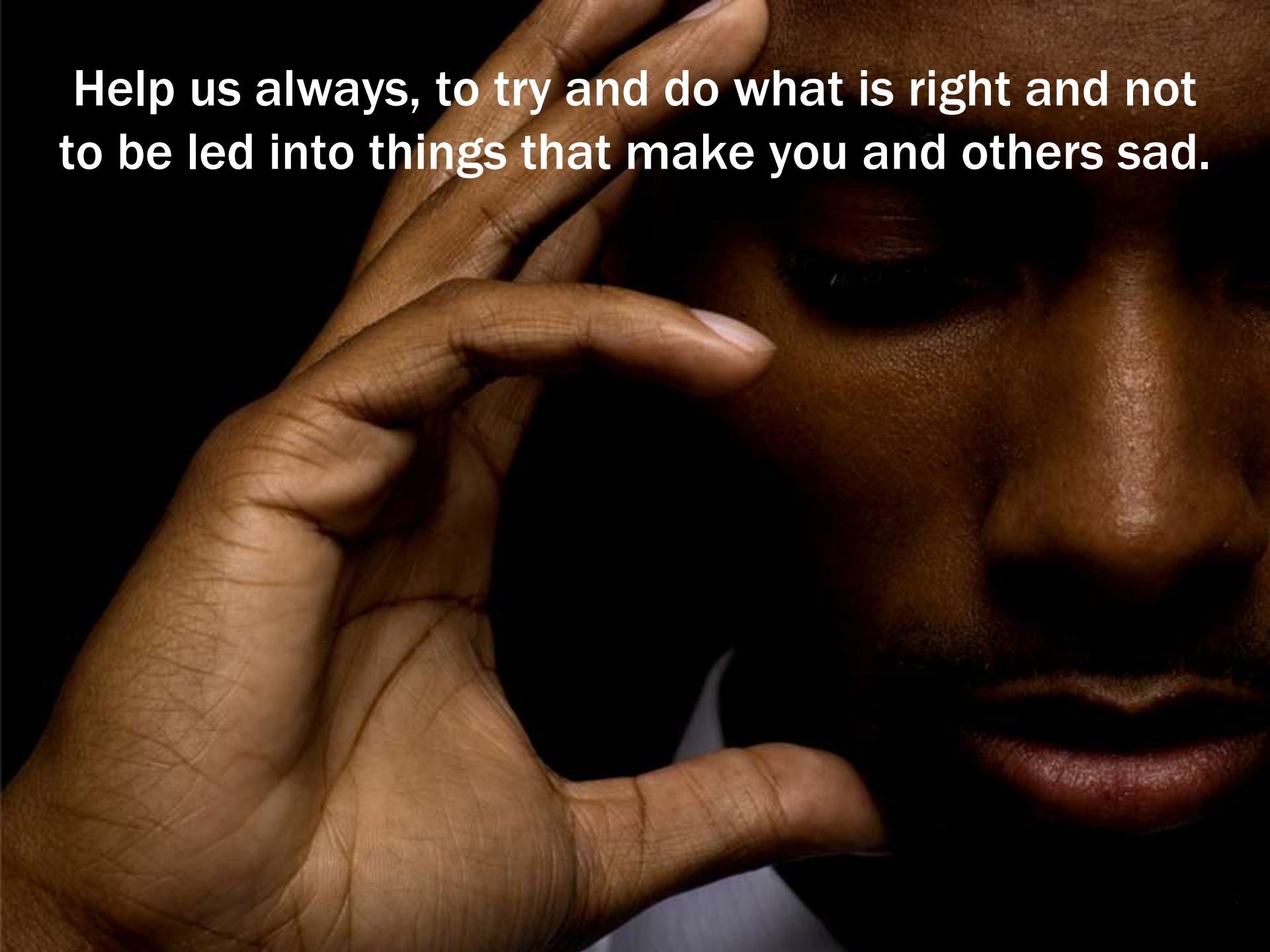
