Receiving the Coffin

The minister meets the coffin at the door of the church and says We receive the body of our brother **David** with confidence in God, the giver of life, who raised the Lord Jesus from the dead.

The coffin may be sprinkled with water, and these words may be used With this water we call to mind **David's** baptism. As Christ went through the deep waters of death for us, so may He bring us to the fullness of resurrection life with David and all the redeemed.

All Amen.

Provincial Bishops Sentences

A pall is placed over the coffin and these words are said


We are already God's children, but what we shall be has not yet been revealed. Yet we know that when Christ appears we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.

A Bible is placed on the coffin, with these words

Lord Jesus Christ, Your living and imperishable word brings us to new birth. Your eternal promises to us and to **David** are proclaimed in the Bible.

A cross may be placed on the coffin, with these words

Lord Jesus Christ, for love of **David** and each one of us You bore our sins on the cross.
